## **Urban CROSS**

#### What is it?

Urban CROSS (Christians Reaching Out in Service in St. Paul) is a week-long service event that is hosted by Mounds Park UMC... it's a "grass-roots locally grown mission project". Our church challenged the youth ministry to help better meet the needs of our neighborhood, to be a greater asset to our community. Since 2010, the Dayton's Bluff/Mounds Park neighborhood has

experienced youth and adults from our church, community, the metro area and beyond as they came together in mission. So, in other words, our church hosts a mission trip. We get to "throw the party" as we feed, provide for showers and sleeping accommodations, event t-shirts that are worn every day by our "missionaries" (and laundered by one of our church volunteers), worship together, fellowship together... oh, and work together. We're bringing the Gospel to the front doorsteps of our neighbors. During the spring, our neighbors submit work requests which our Project Team assess. Projects include the likes of indoor and outdoor painting, yard work, landscaping, minor construction, repairs, clean-up and even planned demolition. Through Urban CROSS we have been able to build some incredible relationships with our neighbors, sponsoring local businesses (restaurants, other churches, etc...), and with each other. There's something about working side-by-side to build bridges. It's also rewarding, as we go about the neighborhood (on my daily walks) to mentally note all the different places we have worked at as I walk by. We are truly a church OF the neighborhood.

2017 Theme: "Many Nations Rooted in Love"

#### **Our Wednesday Evening Community Event**

On a special note: Our Wednesday Evening Community Gathering this year will be an "East Side Festival of Nations". We are inviting ethnic groups and organizations to join us and present to the community their culture, through items and through performances. This event will take place on Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, from 6:00p-8:00p at Indian Mounds Regional Park.

## How can YOU help?

As the June 11-17 week of Urban CROSS approaches, we set our list of ways people can still step forward to help. Examples are: Prayer Team for Urban CROSS overall, Prayer Partners for individual 'campers', help with the kitchen for breakfast, lunch or dinner; working out on the sites, being a driver of supplies, chaperoning a work team, **chaperoning overnight at the church**, helping with the Wednesday Evening Festival of Nations, t-shirt launderer. If you'd like

to make financial or in-kind donations, you may talk to Pastor Dennis or our Administrative Assistant, Kaite.

## Requests for work projects and registrations for campers

Registrations for week-long campers and project requests is May 15. Forms are available on our web site and in the church office. Camper registrations are \$125. More scholarship money is available if needed. Homeowners who request help are not expected to pay for our time. However, we DO appreciate financial help with materials that will be used (paint, tape, wood, etc.), if you are able.

#### **Event t-shirts**

You don't need to be a week-long 'camper', nor anyone who has stepped forward as one of our volunteer staff, and not even a sponsor, to have your own t-shirt. For a suggested donation of \$10 to Urban CROSS, you can order your own. Just call the church office with your name, phone # and size. A sign-up order sheet will also be passed around church during May.

**Urban CROSS "All Hands On Deck meeting"** will be on Sunday, May 21 immediately after church. All team members are requested to attend. Each team will report in, thus giving everyone the needed details of the week. Lunch will be provided.

## **Urban Cross Prayer Partners Needed!**

Every year, one of the things the Urban Cross Ministry Team strives to do is pair someone from Mounds Park UMC's congregation with one (or two) campers for Urban Cross.
